As I begin ministry at Zion Lutheran Church, I want to first express my heartfelt gratitude for the warm welcome you have extended to me and my family. Your openness and hospitality have already shown me the spirit of this congregation. Clarifying Our Shared Purpose

I believe it's important to set clear expectations from the start. My role here is not to single-handedly carry out all the ministry at Zion. Rather, I am here to help our community discern and embrace the ministry to which God has called Zion Lutheran Church as a whole.

Jesus himself began his public ministry by clearly articulating his purpose. In Luke 4:16-19, he stood in the synagogue and read from the prophet Isaiah:

16 He went to Nazareth, where he had been brought up, and on the Sabbath day he went into the synagogue, as was his custom. He stood up to read, 17 and the scroll of the prophet Isaiah was handed to him. Unrolling it, he found the place where it is written:

18 "The Spirit of the Lord is on me, because he has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim freedom for the prisoners and recovery of sight for the blind, to set the oppressed free, 19 to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor."

As followers of Jesus, our ministry should reflect these same priorities. While we face many distractions from daily events and challenges, staying focused on Christ's mission remains essential for our congregation's unity and effectiveness.

# Getting to Know You and Zion's Ministry

My initial focus will be building relationships and understanding the current ministries already flourishing at Zion. I extend an invitation to everyone—whether you're a member or simply part of our community—to schedule time to visit with me. These conversations will help me better understand both you as individuals and our church as a whole.

To make our time together most productive, I'll be providing a questionnaire for you to complete beforehand. This will give you an opportunity to reflect on what you'd like to share and help guide our conversation.

### Discovering Our Gifts and Calling

Together, we will examine the gifts and opportunities God has placed before us. I firmly believe that God has equipped this congregation with all the necessary gifts to fulfill the ministry we're called to do. This requires each person to contribute their unique part, as Saint Paul describes in his teaching about "the body of Christ":7

# **Bible Study I**



# SUNDAY BIBLE CLASS II


On Sunday, May 25th Bible Class II will be started a new study on "The Hundred Prophecies Fulfilled By Jesus" These Sessions are on,

# Remember Your Heavenly Hope

""Let not your heart be troubled. You believe in God, believe also in Me. In my Father's house are many mansions, if it were not so, I would have told you. I go to prepare a place for you. I will come again and receive you to Myself, that where I am, there you may be also. And where I go you know, and the way you know." (John 14:1-4 NKJV)

Back in the beginning in Genesis, God created the heavens and the earth. All was perfect. "And God saw that it was very good" (Genesis 1:10). Over and over again all of creation was declared "good." Adam and Eve walked with God in the garden. They had a perfect relationship of understanding and trust. All was at peace.

And then Satan entered the garden and tempted Adam and Eve. "Did God really mean that?" Sin entered the garden. Suddenly Adam and Eve were

afraid. Distrustful. God removed the Tree of Everlasting Life. God had a plan – a perfect and righteous plan to send His only Son, Jesus, to become our Savior, our substitute on the cross to pay the price for our sin. The Second Adam. Because this "Adam" is the perfect substitute sacrifice, we are able to

live with Him in heaven. It will be a new heaven – a perfect heaven, where fear won't exist and we will live with God and each other in perfect unity. Our relationships will be restored because of Jesus. All our doubts, concerns, cares and stress will fall away. Fatigue will vanish.

Isaiah 40:31 – our strength will be restored – we won't grow tired. The tree of life, mentioned in Genesis, will be in heaven, offering fruits of eternal life. The apostle John wrote of a vision of heaven in the Book of Revelation (Revelation 21:1-5). "Now I saw a new heaven and a new earth, for the first heaven and the first earth had passed away.... And God will wipe away every tear from their eyes" (verse 4).

That is the most (in my opinion) amazing part of heaven. God will be with us. We will know Him. We

will worship in spirit and in truth. It will be a perfect home. God will never be far. Our loved ones will be with us. We will live without sorrow or strife. A home in which we would all want to be.

He puts in the love that only He can provide. Jesus loves us more than anyone ever could (John 2:23). God loves us because of His Son, Jesus. We will spend eternity in heaven with Jesus because of what He has done for us.

As we get older, more discouraged, slower, weaker and in pain, St. Paul writes in 2 Corinthians: Take heart, because our inner person is being renewed daily. He is looking at something we cannot see: eternity (2 Corinthians 5:7).

### **Forgiveness**

I recently read an interesting article on the role of forgiveness in physical and mental health. This was a review of 47 studies on forgiveness.

Three types of forgiveness were described:

Forgiveness of others Self -forgiveness Forgiveness by God

One of the most stressful states comes from being unable to forgive or failure to cope with being wronged. This makes depression and self-blame worse. There is also conditional forgiveness which is requiring contrition from offenders. "I will forgive them if...." This is also called pseudo-forgiveness. While unconditional forgiveness may support physical well-being, *conditional* forgiveness led to increased mortality.

Forgiveness offers significant physical and psychological benefits, particularly in advanced illness and in later life.

Some benefits of forgiveness:


Improved physical health, vitality and longevity

Less infections

Better psychological well-being

Less depression

Healthier management of anger and rumination (dwelling on negative feelings)



Some variables that were found to be associated with forgiveness:

Attachment to God

High beliefs in God-mediated control

Emotional support from members of the church

Parents that encouraged their children to attend church and become involved with religion

Humility

Church attendance

Compassionate love

Old age

This is such important information for us. Those things that help us forgive are benefits that we have as members of a church and religious community. I am pleased to see that the benefits of church and relationship with God are being formally studied and the impact is being recognized. So take comfort in God's forgiveness, forgive others and forgive yourselves.





This project is always a special one, and your community outreach sent students to class ready and equipped to start the new school year. Thank you so much for helping out!
