ASH WEDNESDAY SERVICE

February 18 at 7:00 pm

This Ash Wednesday, we introduce our Lent sermon series, which is based on the ancient hymn "O Love, How Deep" (LSB 544). This hymn, written in the fifteenth century, contemplates the love of God in becoming man, taking on our life, dying our death, and rising again, all *for us*. But for us to understand and appreciate this love, we must first examine ourselves and our lives to see how we have failed in thought, word, and deed. While we may try to get credit for our so-called good works, we all still die with nothing to show for them. But God's love is not like our love. Our love is self-centered and fickle. God's love is steady, deep, and beyond all understanding (Ephesians 3:14–19). This love of God will have no end.

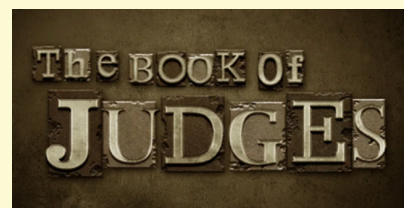


SUNDAY BIBLE CLASS I

Are we living in the end times? Bible Class II will be starting a new Video Study Series "What Happens Next" by Max Lucado on **Sunday February 1st**

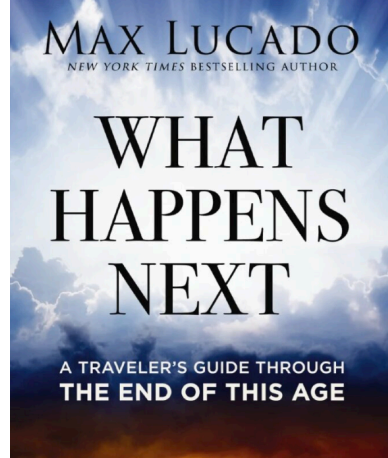
at 8:00am in the Zion Conference Room.

If you are curious about the end times come and join us to hear and study what the Bible has to say.

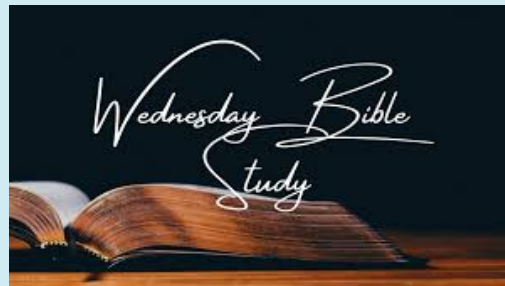

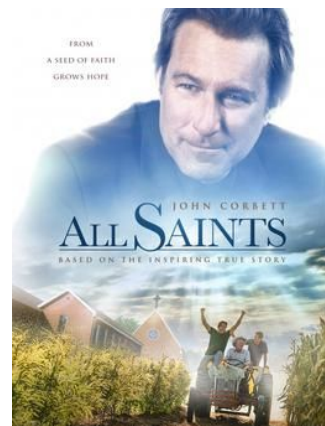
UPDATE FROM THE CHRISTIAN CONCERNS COMMITTEE

During the cold, wet winter months, the doors of the Warming Shelter at Christ Episcopal Church, Alameda, are open to unhoused folks. They offer a warm place to sleep, a shower, clean clothes if needed, and a hot dinner. In the morning, a "grab and go" breakfast bag is given to each overnight guest. The Zion Christian Concerns Committee has already organized and delivered 6 "grab and go" breakfast bag dates in January for 20 overnight Warming Shelter guests, and there are 3 more breakfast bag events on the calendar for February. The breakfast bags consist of cereal, shelf stable milk, a danish pastry, protein bar and fruit. The cost of the breakfast bags is covered by the CCC, but if you would like to donate, you may do so by placing a check in the offering plate.
