SUNDAY BIBLE CLASS I

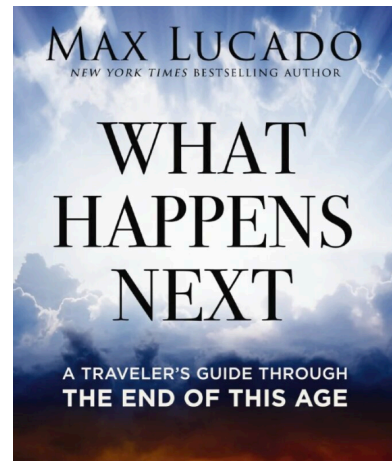

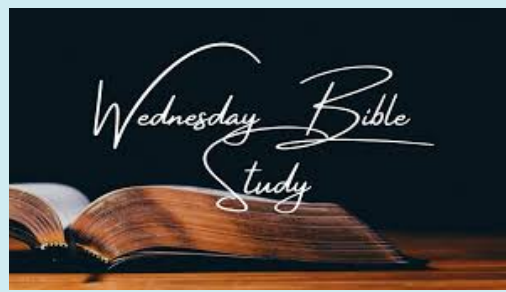
- 1, We were made to reign and rule with Christ
