During October, many churches celebrate the Reformation, a time when we reflect on the purpose of the church. For Lutherans, this isn't just a historical event—it's a reminder that the church must always be reforming itself. Without this ongoing self-evaluation, it's easy to fall into habits that don't reflect God's heart.

This article focuses on God's plan for the world and the church's role in it.

God's Plan for Reconciliation

As described in Ephesians 1:9-10, God's plan is to "unite all things in Christ, things in heaven and things on earth." God's original purpose was for us to live in peace and

harmony, but sin created separation. Jesus came to make us instruments of his peace, calling us to a ministry of reconciliation.

As 2 Corinthians 5:18-20 says, "All this is from God, who through Christ reconciled us to himself and gave us the ministry of reconciliation." We are called to be **ambassadors for Christ**, helping to bridge the divides in our world.

A Divided World and the Church's Calling

Today, we see division everywhere—in global conflicts, political polarization, violence, and even within families and the Christian church itself. Despite having more ways to communicate than ever before, people often feel more lonely and isolated.

Jesus calls his church, the **Body of Christ**, to continue his mission of reconciliation. This begins when we gather together as a congregation to worship and learn. Although we may have different political views or opinions on how the church should function, we come together as one at the Lord's Table.

The Importance of Community

A common misconception in the United States is the idea that you can be a Christian on your own. Many people believe they don't need to be part of a faith community, viewing worship as a private experience "between me and God."

However, God's purpose is to bring people together. The congregation is meant to be a step toward this unity, and we, as followers of Jesus, are called to be **peacemakers**. Gathering in person is crucial. As Jesus prayed in John 17, he desired for his followers to be "all one...so that the world may believe that you have sent me."

The ministry of reconciliation is not a solo journey. It's a shared mission that begins by coming together as a community.



Bible Study I



SUNDAY BIBLE CLASS II


On Sunday, Bible Class II continues the study of "The Hundred Prophecies Fulfilled By Jesus"

Remember Amazing Grace

"Grace is the on-going, benevolent act of God working in us, without which we can do nothing (John 15:5)" (Godquestions.org). As Lutherans, we learn in confirmation class that Grace is God's gift without any merit in us. Luther explains in his explanation to the First article in the Apostle's Creed: "All this He does out of Fatherly, divine goodness and mercy without any merit or worthiness in me."

Undeserved – a complete gift of mercy. The work of salvation was completed by Jesus's sacrifice on the cross. <u>God's Riches At Christ's Expense</u>. Not even a tiny effort of ours was required. A gift placed in our hands.

"Jesus paid it all
All to Him I owe
Sin had left a crimson stain
He washed it white as snow."

After learning those words of hope and forgiveness, John Newton (1772) wrote the words to the beloved hymn, Amazing Grace. He had transformed from

the captain of a slave ship to a clergyman – saved from evil to good by GRACE. We are all saved from the result of sin by grace – there is nothing we do – simply receive this unfathomable gift.

As I listen to and sing the words of this beautiful hymn, I will share some of my thoughts and prayers.

"Amazing grace, how sweet the sound
That saved a wretch like me
I once was lost but now am found
Was blind but now I see.
My chains are gone, I've been set free,
My God, My Savior has ransomed me,
and like a flood His mercy reigns;
unending love, amazing grace."

(2 Corinthians 8:9) "For you know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though He was rich, yet for your sake He became poor, so that you, by His poverty, might become rich."

(Hebrews 2:17, 18) "Therefore in all things He had to be made like His brethren that He might be a

merciful and faithful High Priest in things pertaining to God to make propitiation for the sins of the people. For in that He Himself has suffered, being tempted, He is able to help those who are tempted."

God's grace is truly amazing. We who were deep in sin, were sent a substitute, a sacrificial Lamb to give the ultimate sacrifice on a cross for the forgiveness of our sins. Jesus took our place on the cross. We will spend eternity in heaven thanking Him.

"Twas grace that taught my heart to fear And Grace my fears relieved How precious did that grace appear The hour I first believed."

Do you remember how you felt when you first heard or relearned that God loves you so much that He sent His only Son to save you from the punishment of your sins – that your sins were forgiven and you were made new? Your guilt was gone, your sins as far from the east as from the west (Psalm 103:16).

"But God, who is rich in mercy, because of His great love with which He loves us, even when we were dead in trespasses, made us alive together with Christ (by grace you have been saved), and raised us up together." (Ephesians 2:4, 5)

(Ephesians 2:8, 9) "For by grace you have been saved, through faith, and that not of yourselves; it is the gift of God, not by works, lest anyone should boast."

"Through many dangers, toils and snares
We have already come,
Twas grace that brought us safe thus far
And grace will bring us home."

We have all gone through difficult times – times of grief and hopelessness, loss and pain. Our life-line to God is Grace. It is because of Grace that we can come to God our Father: (1 Peter 3:18) "Christ suffered once for sins, the righteous for the unrighteous that He might bring us to God."

2 Timothy 1:9) "Who has saved us and called us with a holy calling, not according to our works but according to His own purpose and grace which was given to us in Christ Jesus before time began."

This is the gift of strength in Jesus. We can never be left without this gift of grace. He has promised to be with us. Let these difficult times bring you closer to Jesus.

We've no less days to sing God's praise
Than when we first begun."

Oh can you imagine the choirs in heaven singing praises to Jesus? Our faith will be sight – all our questions answered. We will hear Jesus say "Well done, good and faithful servant" (Matthew 5:23). We will sing and praise Him – an everlasting worship service.

Parish Nursing

For this month's newsletter, I would like to share a couple of tension relieving techniques to start and end your day. Perhaps you can combine these with prayer or do them before or after prayer.

Morning

Deep breathing is a wonderful way to both wake up and release tension. Begin by lying down and giving your toes a little wiggle. Touch the crown of your head to become more attuned to the top of your body. As you breathe in, imagine your inhale traveling down to your toes. As you




exhale, fell your breath moving back up to the crown of your head. Take another inhale, just down to your knees and an exhale back up. Keep going, breathing into your pelvis and exhaling to your crown. Into your belly and out to your crown. Into your chest and out. Into your jaw and out. From there, take the return journey down the length of the body. By the time you're done, you should feel more relaxed and alert.

Evening

When you're ready for bed but haven't had time to unwind from the day, use this breathing technique to tuck yourself in. Get into bed and find a comfortable position. Close your eyes and feel the delightfulness of the mattress under you. Feel the embrace of the sheets and blankets on top of you. Then place one hand on your stomach and one hand on your chest. Notice how your hands move up and down, like a boat on a gentle tide. If your mind begins replaying worries or concerns, release them to God. Come back to the breath and rest in God's comfort and care.


