Pastor Paul writes...

"And in the same region there were shepherds out in the field, keeping watch over their flock by night. And an angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were filled with great fear."

- The Christmas Gospel, Luke 2:8-9

"And the angel said to them, 'Fear not, for behold, I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior,

who is Christ the Lord." - The Christmas Gospel, Luke 2:10-11 ESV (English Standard Version)

Some of you may remember hearing the Christmas Gospel in the King James Version on Christmas Eve and Christmas Day. When Luke 2 is read in the King James Version, much like Psalm 23 and other familiar passages, it is unparalleled in linguistic beauty and majesty. But even if you learned the Christmas Gospel in a more recent translation, the Christmas story is no less meaningful, moving, and powerful.

This year for the Christmas Eve and Christmas Day messages at Zion we are going to focus on the Christmas angel. Luke records the important role of the Christmas angel who appeared to the shepherds and brought them the good news of the Savior born for all people. On Christmas Eve we will look at the first two verses above (Luke 2:8-9) and on Christmas Day we will look at the second set of two verses (Luke 2:10-11).

What was the significance of Christmas angel coming to the shepherds? What was the significance of the message the angel delivered to them? What do these verses reveal about Christmas? About Christ? About us? How do these verses apply to our Christmas celebrations and our lives of faith today? We will explore all these questions this Christmas!

I hope you can join us in person for both Christmas Eve and Christmas Day, but if you cannot do that, then be sure to join us online for the livestream or 24/7 at your convenience.

Why did Frosty ask for a divorce? His wife was a total flake.



# A Response to a Magnificent Prayer

And Mary said: "My soul magnifies the Lord. For He has regarded the lowly state of His maidservant. For behold, henceforth all generations will call me blessed. For He has done great things for me. And holy is His name. And His mercy is on those who fear Him from generation to generation."

(Luke 2:46-50 NKJV)

The busy-ness of everyday life: errands to run, family to care for, people to encourage and visit. Preparations before a special event such as a wedding – are all-consuming. Every little girl dreams of becoming a princess or a beautiful bride. Such a blessed, happy time that she will always remember no matter how many years go by. And into this busy-ness comes Gabriel, God's servant angel with a message for Mary.

"Now in the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent by God to a city of Galilee named Nazareth, to a virgin betrothed to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David. The virgin's name was Mary. And having come in, the angel said to her, 'Do not be afraid Mary, for you have found favor with God. And behold you will conceive in your womb and bring forth a Son and shall call His name JESUS. He will be great, and will be called the Son of the Highest, and the Lord God will give Him the throne of His father David. And He will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and of His kingdom there will be no end." (Luke 2:26-33)

Wow. In an instant everything changed. It went from happy preparation to bewildered desperation. "How can this be?" (Luke 2:34) Mary asks. She could legally be stoned to death by Joseph. And the angel understood her dilemma. "The Holy Spirit will overshadow you, therefore, also that the Holy One who is to be born will be called the Son of God." (Luke 2:35)

Mary's preparations ended. She would have to go and tell her beloved Joseph. Simple, humble Mary. Lowly man of trade, carpenter Joseph. Not one of wealth or high position. Just two ordinary people used in God's plan of salvation.

And Mary's response? "Behold, the maidservant (literally 'slave') of the Lord. Let it be to me according to your word." (Luke 2:38)

Every Jewish girl dreamed of being the mother of the promised Messiah. Now, here is Mary, suddenly thrust into that role. And Joseph was a just man who had to make the decision to shame Mary, stone her to death or marry her. He has his love for her and the angel's message to take her as his wife as she carries the Son of God (Matthew 2). Two everyday people,

put into a life-changing situation. And how did they respond?

They both said "Yes".

Mary's Spirit-led prayer after the angel's visit is also called the Magnificat. It is a prayer of praise and acknowledgement of what God has done and will do for the people. She knew the promise of the Messiah. She had heard the Scriptures. And now God was putting her into the role of the mother of the Messiah, God's Son. Joy and Fear. I can't imagine how she felt, Such a blessing and such a terror, for her, a virgin.

Martin Luther wrote a book on the Magnificat. His writing was published by Concordia Publishing House in 1956: Volume 21. Mary's very soul rejoices in God, her Savior. Her very life rejoices. "God is magnified in our knowledge and experience when we greatly esteem Him and highly regard Him, His grace and goodness." (page 307)

Do we realize how many times God uses us, simple, humble humans in His plans? His plans are perfect. All thankfulness and glory go to Him. Mary praises God and asks Him for strength.

"I have traveled many moonless nights Cold and weary with a babe inside And I wonder what I've done Holy Father You have come

And chosen me now to carry Your Son.
I am waiting in silent prayer
I am frightened by the load I bear
In a world cold as stone

Must I walk this path alone?

Be with me now.

Be with me now. Breath of heaven

Hold me together

Be forever near me.

Lighten my darkness Pour over me your holiness

Luther writes of 1 Corinthians 1:27,28 "God chose what is foolish in the world to shame the wise. God chose the weak of the world to shame the strong. God chose what is low and despised in the world." (page 34) When God comes into our "busy-ness" and our life changes, let our response be "Yes Lord! I am willing to follow You."
