SUNDAY BIBLE CLASS I

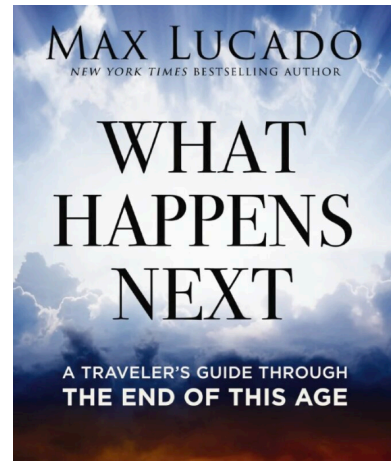

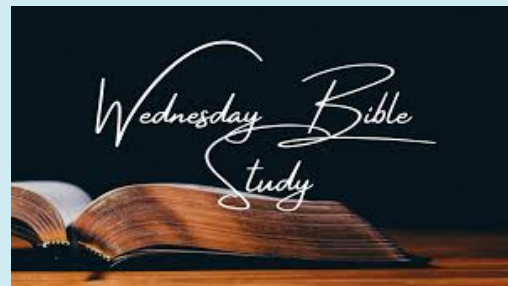
1. We were made to reign and rule with Christ

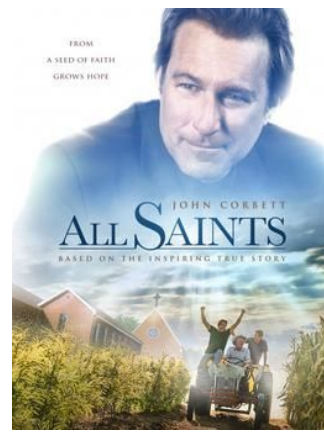
Movie Night
